





- Cheap landfill and waste disposal
- Illegal dumping
- Large distances between nodes
- Buyisa-e-bag plastic bag levy
- Over-regulation/ tendency to favour taxation

Environmental Education cont...

Challenges:

- Environmental fatigue
- Messaging for different consumer markets
- Lack of consistency of messaging
- Confusion around eco-labelling and mobius
- Definition of recyclability vs recycled
- Lack of drop off facilities and services
- Education around S @ S and responsible consumption


Governance cont...
