Mauricio Claver-Carone is Deputy Assistant to the President and Senior Director for Western Hemisphere Affairs at the National Security Council. In this capacity, he serves as the President's principal advisor on issues related to Canada, Latin America and the Caribbean. Mauricio previously served as the United States Executive Director at the International Monetary Fund ('IMF'), where he represented the United States, as the largest shareholder, on the IMF's Executive Board. He also served as Senior Advisor for International Affairs at the U.S. Department of the Treasury.

Prior to his current government service, he was Executive Director of Cuba Democracy Advocates in Washington, D.C., a non-partisan organization dedicated to the promotion of human rights, free markets and the rule of law. He was also host of the bilingual foreign policy show 'From Washington al Mundo' on Sirius XM Radio and the co-founder of a data-software start-up company. Mauricio began his career as an Attorney-Advisor for the U.S. Department of the Treasury's Office of the Comptroller of the Currency, where he provided counsel on banking laws, capital requirements and securitizations. He was also a Clinical Assistant Professor at The Catholic University of America's School of Law and an Adjunct Professor at The George Washington University's National Law Center.

Mauricio earned his Bachelor of Arts degree from Rollins College, Juris Doctor from The Catholic University of America, and Master of Laws in International and Comparative Law from Georgetown University Law Center.
